THE ROSIN BOX PROJECT launches Frontline Performance campaign to give back to Essential Workers

Looking for a way to give back to COVID-19 first responders and essential workers in San Diego, AND support a local nonprofit? Since the beginning of the pandemic crisis, San Diego's essential workers have been working beyond capacity. They risk their personal health every day and place the public's health and safety above their own wellbeing without hesitation.

The Rosin Box Project, San Diego's premier summer contemporary ballet company, is launching a crowdfunding campaign to help raise support to give back to essential workers by way of a Frontline Performance to be held on August 29, 2020, at 2 pm at the Tenth Avenue Arts Center, San Diego, California. As a part of their August Series performances for the 2020 Season: Critical Movements, TRBP is adding one special show JUST for the frontline essential workers: doctors, nurses, law enforcement, and the people keeping the food supply viable, and spaces clean and safe. Humbled by the bravery and commitment, this performance is TRBP's way of showing their heartfelt appreciation. The TRBP artists, staff, and directors are united under the belief that sharing the art of dance has the power to bring everyone closer to humanity and closer together, especially during a time of need.

About The Rosin Box Project:


The Rosin Box Project is an exciting new contemporary ballet company based out of the San Diego area, presenting high-quality performances of world-class professional dancers in a genuinely unfiltered atmosphere through uniquely choreographed and curated intimate performances. The founding objective was to create a space for artistic growth and exploration by offering dancers and choreographers the opportunity to collaborate and develop their own artistic visions, inspiring creativity, and ingenuity of which they may not normally have the opportunity to. Immediately following the close of the first season, a second mission fell strongly into place: To serve the community through art and dance by expanding its reach and deepening the understanding of, and connection to, the art form through unique programs that invite audiences to STEP INSIDE, granting new entry to the transformative power of dance, offering new access to the art-form to see and feel the collective heartbeats that make up the pulse of a larger company.

Founder and Artistic Director, Carly Topazio, created The Rosin Box Project (TRBP) in May 2018. Topazio assembled a collective of dancers to present an original view on contemporary ballet. The small team quickly became a family and orchestrated every aspect of putting on a production and curating visual appeal - choreographing, fundraising, marketing, and directing. The first two performance seasons were presented in intimate black box theaters around San Diego, to exclusively sold-out houses every performance.

TRBP continues to grow and venture further "outside the box" of traditional ballet performance experiences; broadening its boundaries and aiming to create more palpable and visceral shows for its growing audiences.
